Saving Lives

Acts 20:19, "I served the Lord with great humility and with tears and in the midst of severe testing."

Adolfo Kaminsky knew how to remove indelible ink from paper. As a member of the anti-Nazi resistance in France, he altered identification cards to save hundreds from concentration camps. Once he was given three days to forge nine hundred birth and baptismal certificates and ration cards for three hundred Jewish children. He labored two straight days without sleep, telling himself, "In one hour I can make thirty blank documents. If I sleep for an hour thirty people will die."

The apostle Paul felt a similar urgency. He reminded the church in Ephesus how he'd "served the Lord with great humility and with tears and in the midst of severe testing" (Acts 20:19). Paul said, "I have not hesitated to preach anything that would be helpful to you" (v. 20). This urgency compelled him to share with everyone the necessity of repentance and faith in Jesus (v. 21). Now he was sailing back to Jerusalem, eager to "finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus [had] given [him]—the task of testifying to the good news of God's grace" (v. 24).

Paul couldn't save people. Only God does that. But he could tell them God's good news about Jesus, the only "name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12).

Our Shield and Reward

Genesis 15:1, Psalm 84:11, Ephesians 6:16

When Fear Creeps In

- •Abraham's deepest fear was that he would remain childless.
- •Our greatest fears often come after battle, not during it.
- Answered prayers and success lead to responsibilities we question, because both reveal our deep need for someone beyond ourselves.
- •God does not wait for us to overcome our fears alone.

I Am Your Shield

- •God does not offer Abraham a better military strategy or stronger armor, He offers Himself.
- •God does not promise help from a distance.
- •God, as our shield, protects us from more than external enemies; He shields us from internal

attacks that often do more damage.

- •Faith is entrusting ourselves to God as our shield.
- •Knowing that God is our shield does not automatically protect us, we must actively trust Him.

I Am Your Great Reward

- •God does not say, "I will give you a great reward," He says, "I AM your great reward."
- •God Himself is our inheritance, our prize, our ultimate satisfaction.
- •We live in a world constantly telling us what we need in order to be happy.
- •God knows that what we need, what our souls long for, is not something from Him but Him.

Redefining Success

•Success is not getting all our prayers answered as we hope but discovering that the One we are praying to is the answer we did not know we needed.

- God wanted Abraham to understand that even the promised son was not the ultimate oThe God who met Abraham in his midnight prize, but God Himself was.
- •Jesus is our reward, because in Him we have •Is God enough for you? The answer to that every spiritual blessing.

Is God Enough

- •The question confronting us today is the same one that confronted Abraham 4,000 years ago: Is God enough?
- •Is God still your most significant reward, or have the blessings become your god?
- When we hold God as our greatest reward, we hold everything else with open hands.
- Our shield and reward is not something that can be taken away; He is someone who promises never to leave us or forsake us.

Conclusion

- God's word to us today is the same as to Abraham: "Do not be afraid. I am your shield, your great reward."
- Take God at His word, trust Him as your shield

and receive Him as your reward.
