Life Is Out Of Control

- Daniel was not the cause of the king's troubled mental state, sleeplessness, or his disturbing dreams.
- Daniel's life was in danger because of the failures of others.
- When life seems out of control, a wise person understands that he can control how he responds to it.
- Get the facts straight and figure out the cause of the problem.
- Make space for a solution, by asking for time, looking for flexibility, and reducing the anxiety level.

How Do You Get Control Of Your Response

- Daniel prayed a prayer of faith.
- Daniel praised God BEFORE he knew how everything would turn out.
- The most important answer to his prayer was not that God solved his problem, but he could believe God was in control.
- When life is out of our control, it is enough to know that God is in control.

The Dream

- The historical interpretation of the statue is open for discussion.
- The details of the statue are not important.
- Its the rock that comes into the vision that is important.
- The rock represents the kingdom of God that fills the earth and endures forever, and Jesus is the King.
- In our dreams and visions in the night, or the darkness of the day, the dazzling statue sometimes looms large.
- The eyes of faith see something else: a rock that will crush the powers before it, filling the whole earth.

Conclusion

- When our lives seem out of our control, and the kingdoms and powers of this world loom large, we have an even greater vision than Daniel, we have a vision of Jesus.
- Jesus will arise from the dead, overcome every power and authority, and establish a kingdom that will fill all things and endure forever.
