Pleasure

- Solomon pursued many different avenues of pleasure.
- He followed the hedonistic philosophy of life.
- He extracted pleasure from every avenue of life, which always ended meaningless.
- The pure pursuit of pleasure alone is meaningless.
- As we grow older, we learn that all those things that we pursue end up less than satisfying.
- If we pursue something too hard and too long, we actually may damage our ability to find pleasure in anything.

Overstimulation

- The younger generation has overstimulated their brains which limites their ability to experience any long-term pleasure.
- We have overstimulated our brain so much that we are not able to experience pleasure to the degree in which we were meant.
- Each of us have a place in our brain that is responsible for helping us to feel pleasure when it is stimulated.
- Our children are being raised in a world with the potential for stimulation 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- Constant over-stimulation destroys our ability to achieve any sense of pleasure.

Become Lovers of God

- We must become lovers of God rather than lovers of pleasure.
- We must destroy the idols that we have made in our lives.
- We do not have to stop pursuing pleasure, but we need to reverse things and make God our highest form of pleasure.
- Real sin is being satisfied with the things in the world when God wants to offer us so much more.

Real Pleasure

- When we pursue God with heart, soul, mind, and strength, we will begin to find real pleasure in life.
- When we pursue God, we will view the pleasures of this earth not as idols but as gifts from Him.
- As God opens pathways to pleasure, we will experience things that are not only valid here but valid into the life to come.
- As we pursue a relationship with Jesus Christ, we truly begin to tap into the eternal pleasures of God.
