Doomsday

- The world is still in existence.

- The 2000th year after the birth of Christ actually came and passed in 1994, 1995, or 1996.
- Jesus said there would be no special sign of His coming.

Hinge Date In History

- People were hyped up to believe that 2000 was a “monumental hinge date in history.”
- 15 million people in this country believed that Jesus would return on January 1, 2000.
- The entertainment Industry capitalized on doomsday predictions.
- The people who most exploited the turn of the millennium were religious teachers.

Second Coming Of Christ

- We need to be ready for His coming at any moment.
- If God gave us the precise time of Christ's return, the natural tendency of people would be to put off following Christ till the last minute.
- When you do not know the exact time that someone is coming, it changes your outlook on getting ready.
- The most dangerous of all delusions is that there is plenty of time.

- Christ's delay should be viewed as a sign that God loves us and wants to give us every opportunity to get ourselves ready.
