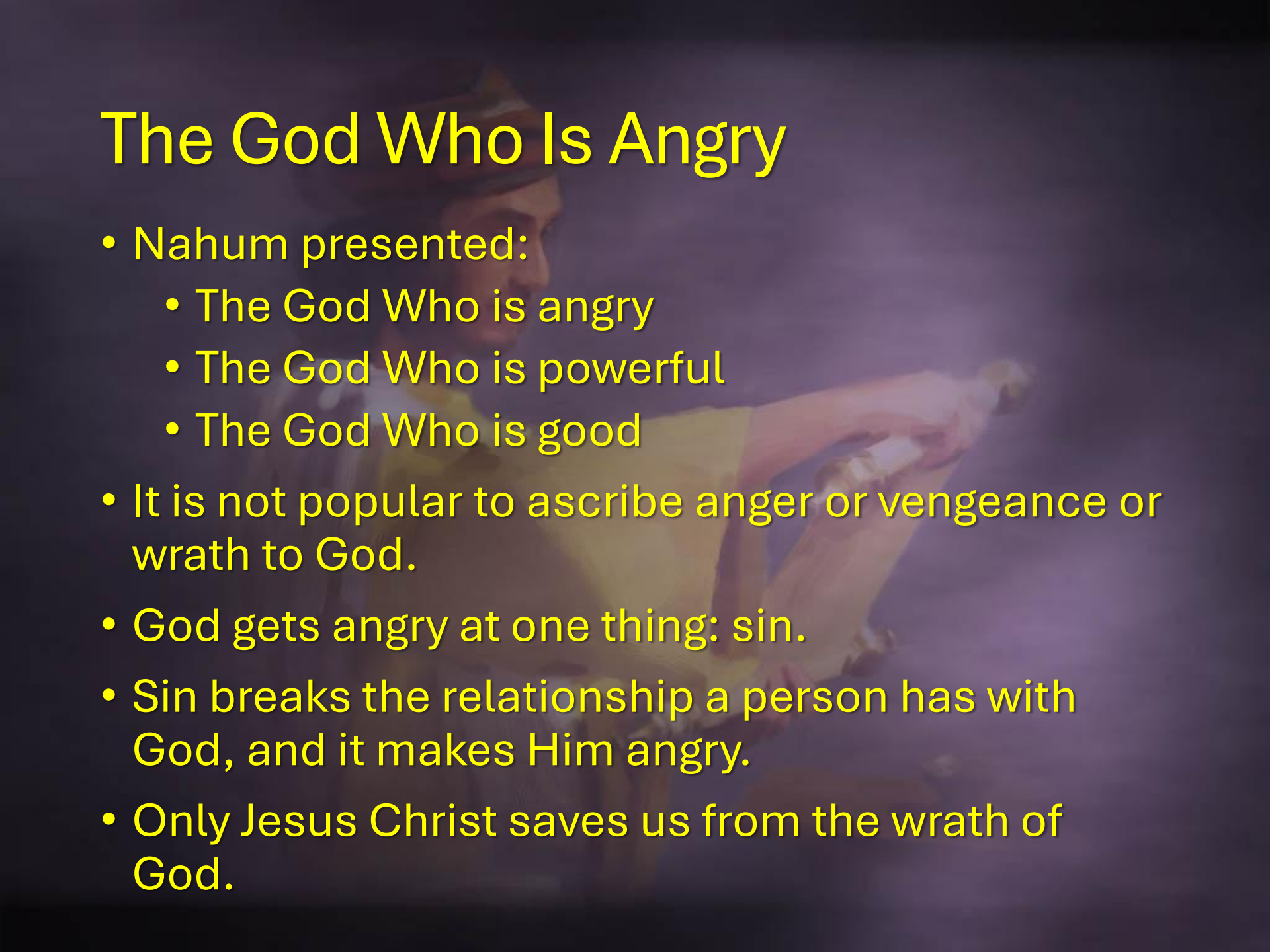

The God Who Is Angry



- Nahum presented:
 - The God Who is angry
 - The God Who is powerful
 - The God Who is good
- It is not popular to ascribe anger or vengeance or wrath to God.
- God gets angry at one thing: sin.
- Sin breaks the relationship a person has with God, and it makes Him angry.
- Only Jesus Christ saves us from the wrath of God.

The God Who Is Powerful

- Nahum presents a vision of God where He is powerful.
- God is the only Being Who is:
 - Omnipotent
 - Omnific
 - Omniscient
 - Omnipresent
- God limits His power for our benefit.
- God's power secures our salvation.

The God Who Is Good

- God is only GOOD and HOLY.
- Nahum said God is good immediately after explaining how wrathful and powerful God is.
- God Who is good is in a category all by Himself.
- Our coming to God for protection and our trust in Him are based on the foundation of His goodness.
- We can fully trust God because He is only good.

Conclusion

- God does not contradict Himself.
- Our God is angry at sin.
- Our God is all-powerful.
- Our God is only good.
- This Angry, Powerful, Good God set in motion a plan for salvation for everyone who is a sinner.
