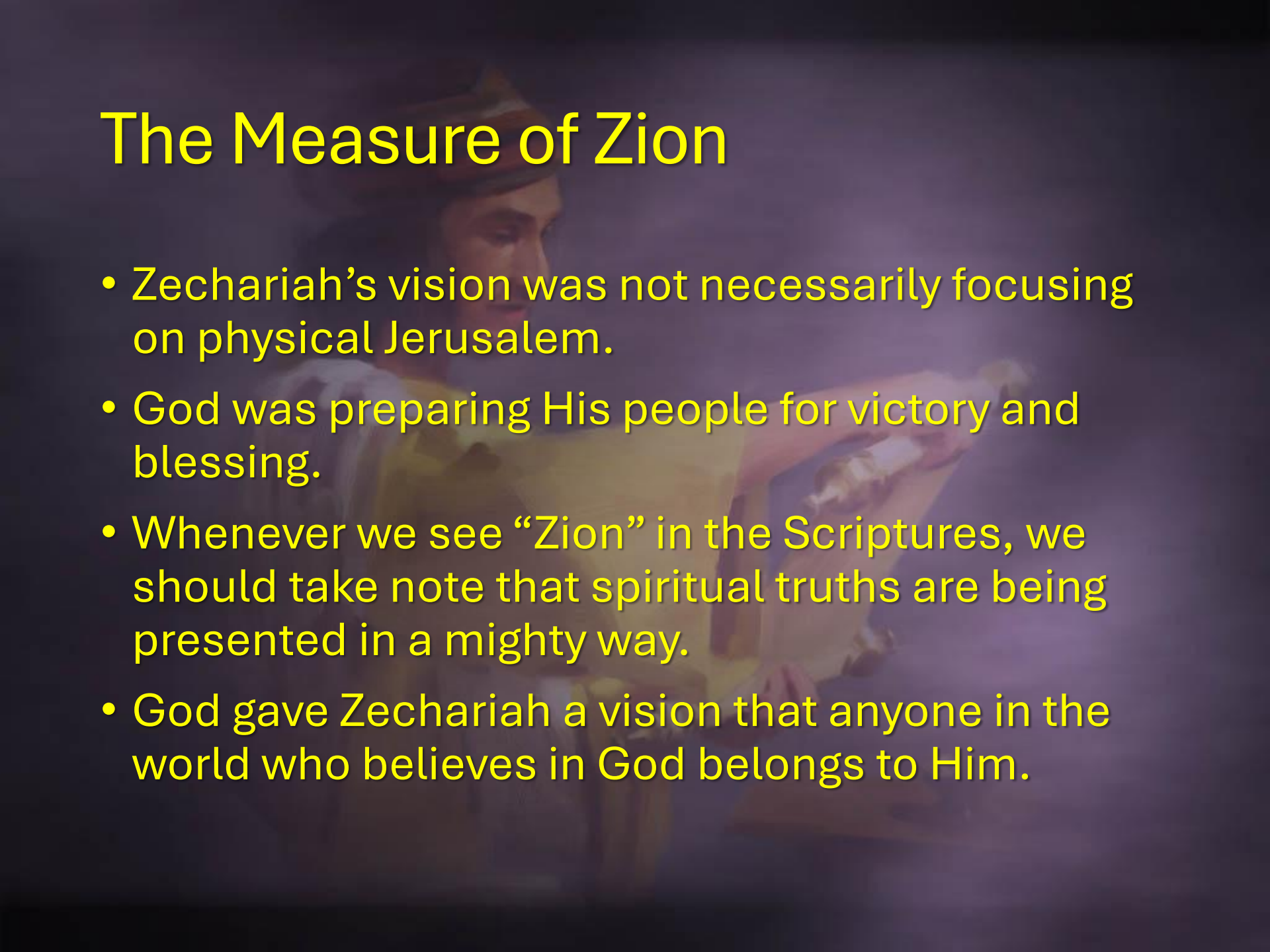
The Measure of What God Will Do

- Whatever was going on in this vision had nothing to do with his time, and everything to do with the future.
- The future glory of Jerusalem is spiritual.

The Measure of Zion



- Zechariah's vision was not necessarily focusing on physical Jerusalem.
- God was preparing His people for victory and blessing.
- Whenever we see "Zion" in the Scriptures, we should take note that spiritual truths are being presented in a mighty way.
- God gave Zechariah a vision that anyone in the world who believes in God belongs to Him.
